New York State Conference Membership

The most recent membership information was obtained from Katherine Isaac of the AAUP National Office on April 8, 2008. The figures show that the New York State Conference currently has 5,015 members, which represents a 1.3 percent decline from 5,079 members in Fall 2007. These include 4,687 members of formal chapters at forty-six individual institutions in the public and independent sectors throughout New York State as well as 216 members at ninety-nine institutions with fewer than seven members and 112 additional members without affiliation. Currently, eleven of the chapters are collective bargaining chapters with a total of 3,592 members, a 1.8 percent decrease from 3,658 members that were reported by the National Office last fall.

Observations

It is of interest to note that, since October 2007, 17 chapters showed an increase in membership, 21 chapters experienced a decline in membership, and 8 chapters maintained the same membership. Most of the chapters experienced changes in membership that were negligible. However, there were a few chapters where the changes were significant: D’Youville’s membership increased 30% from 77 to 103; LIU-A&M Schwartz College increased 36% from 39 to 53; Molloy College increased 14% from 90 to 103; NYU increased 18% from 88 to 104; St. John’s University-Others increased 45% from 42 to 61; Hofstra’s membership declined 23% from 634 to 489; Pace University/NY Chapter declined 28% from 18 to 13; Syracuse University declined 15% from 86 to 73; and Wells College declined 38% from 21 to 13. In addition, the number of AAUP members without affiliation increased 70% from 66 to 112.
